

# Northeast MO Hotspot - Warrenton

Discovering Employment Trends with Local Employment Dynamics (LED)

Warrenton is an economic and employment center for the Northeast region of Missouri. This report details the workers and industries that make this place a hotspot of economic activity.



## Northeast Employment Hotspots

The largest concentrations of employment in the Northeast Workforce Investment Area are found in the cities of Hannibal, Kirksville, Moberly, and Troy. Various localities within St. Charles and St. Louis County are also employment hotspots for Northeast region residents. Workforce Investment Areas are the result of the federal Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA) which funds a number of employment and training programs across the nation.

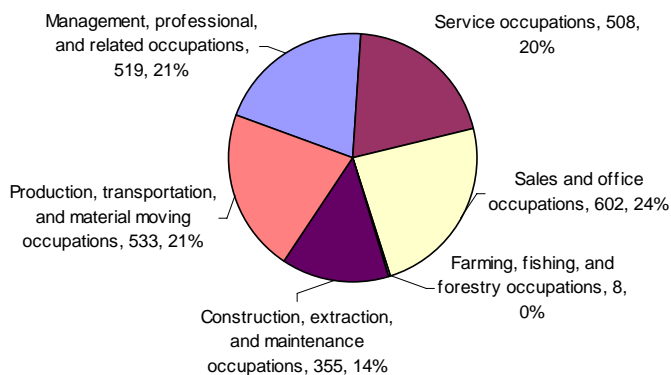


In 2004, nearly 80% of all workers in the Northeast region were employed in the private sector, and almost 20% were employed in the public sector. Over 27% of all workers were employed in the cities of Hannibal (10%), Kirksville (7%), Moberly (6%) and Troy (4.5%). Employment in St. Charles and St. Louis Counties accounted for 18% of jobs.

## Warrenton Census Overview

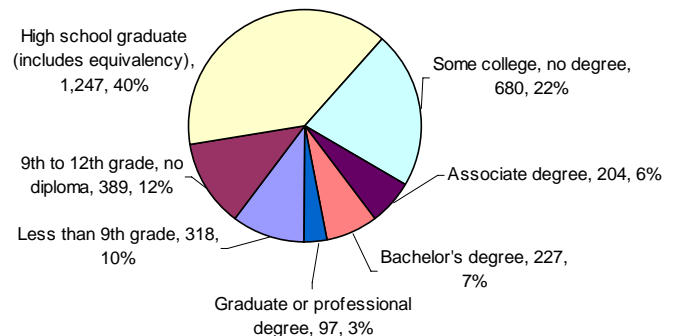
In 2000, Warrenton had a population of 5,209 with a median age of 32 years old. The majority of residents were employed in sales and office occupations. 40% had a high school education or higher.

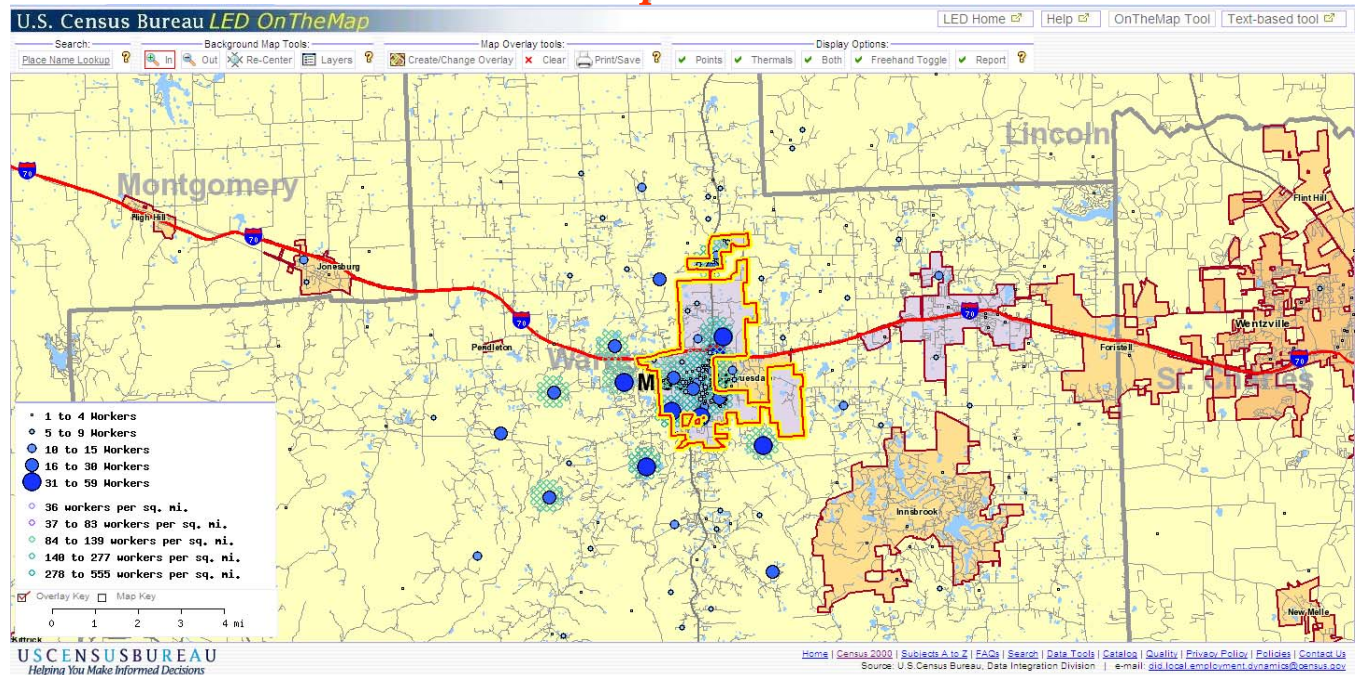
## Where do Warrenton's Workers Live?

Most people employed in Warrenton also live there (48%). Residents of Warren County, where Warrenton is located, account for over 43% of all employees.

The Local Employment Dynamics (LED) program is a partnership between the U.S. Census Bureau and the agencies in each state that generate and analyze labor market information. The LED On-the-Map tool allows you to designate either an area where workers work and determine where they live, or designate where residents live and determine where those workers commute.

## What Industries Employ Warrenton Workers?

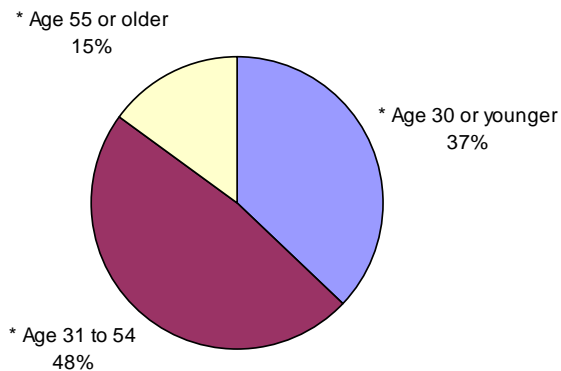
The majority of jobs in Warrenton are in retail trade and educational services, followed by accommodation and food services and health care and social assistance.

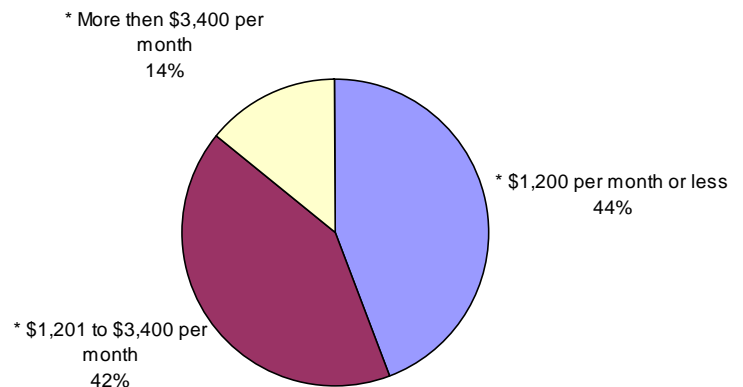
