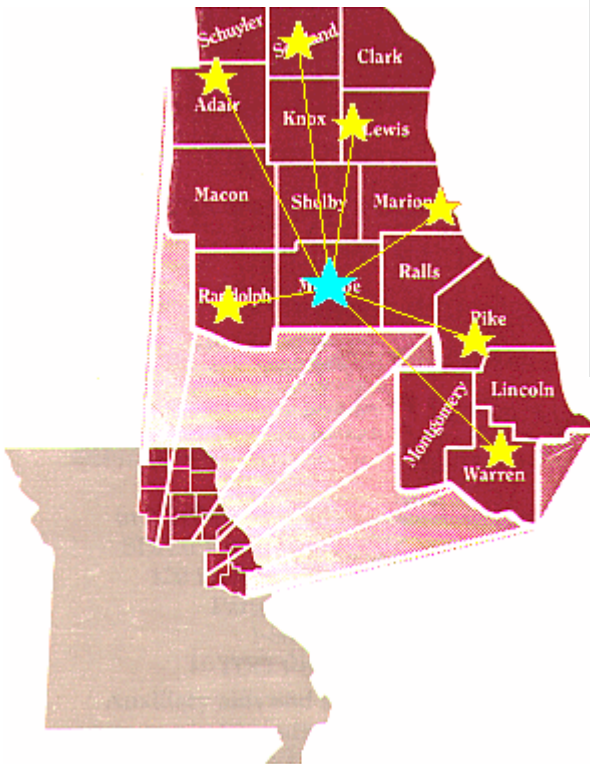

Local Resources

University Outreach and Extension provides educational resources and program on topics including children, youth, families, parent education, child care education, anger management, money management, food safety and preservation, leadership development, community development, agriculture, and topics related to the home environment.

4-H Club Experiences and Events- Year long or multi-month programming that may at times focus on a specific subject, but is designed for development of “the whole person”. Multiple strategies are used to convey information and develop personal skills and abilities. To support and enhance the programs within each of the 4-H Clubs, the following types of programmatic efforts are available: Achievement events; Livestock, Horse, and Meats Judging; Teen Leadership Development: Multiple areas and state events; Educational trips and workshops; Life skill development in project areas; Youth and Volunteer Recognition Program; Area Fairs, Youth Camping Program.

Character Development- Get in touch with the six pillars of character: Trustworthiness, Fairness, Responsibility, Respect, Citizenship, Caring. Grades K-Adult

“Going The Distance”- Learn to trust and help others. Team building, positive risk taking. Grades 5- Adult

Tackling Tough Skills: Building Skills for Work and Life- this program is designed for working with hard to reach audiences particularly those who are low income. The various subject areas include Attitude, Responsibility, Communication, Decision Making/Problem solving , and Preparing for the Work Place.

True Colors- Unlock your potential for success through understanding yourself and others. True Colors provides all of us with an opportunity to open our hearts and minds to our own potential, recognize and encourage potential in others and open the doors to successful relationships and a climate for effective learning.

Volunteer Development- These programs work with groups of adults and older youth to build their capacity to work with youth in non-formal educational settings. 4-H Philosophy; Experiential Learning Cycle; 4-H Club Management; Risk Management; Ages and Stages of Youth Development; and Working with People.

Community Youth Development- Each 4-H Youth Development Specialist works with individuals and groups within the community to address the needs of the local youth and those who work with them. Some examples of community groups that partner with University of Missouri 4-H Youth Development Specialists are: United Way; Caring Communities; Fair Association/Boards; 4-H and Extension Councils; Community Action

Agencies; Colleges and Universities; Elementary, Middle and High schools; After school Programs, Juvenile Justice Centers; Division of Family Services; Churches and Faith-based Groups; Civic Clubs and Groups; and Parenting Groups and Coalitions.

4-H S.E.R.I.E.S (Science Experiences and Resources for Informal and Recreational educational Settings) includes a variety of hands-on activities related to science processes/concepts. SERIES focuses on environmental and societal issues important to everyone's life. Adult Education and Literacy is designed to provide adult students the opportunity to achieve as much academic progress as possible in order to be more productive individuals. This is accomplished by teaching students reading, writing, math skills, science and social studies. A degree of success in these areas decreases the student's dependence on others, and improves their ability to benefit from occupational and homemaking training, increases their opportunities for more profitable employment, and enhance their preparedness to meet adult responsibilities.

Additional information:

- Classes are free! However, they are for adults only.
- Books and materials are free and should remain in class
- New students (16 and older) may enroll at any times.
- If you are 16 or 17 years old, an "Authorization to Enroll" form must be on file to enroll
- Instruction is individualized to meet the students goals, levels, and speed
- Students must sign in when they arrive and leave class. They are encouraged to stay for the entire class
- If the student must miss class because of responsibilities outside of class, the student is encouraged to return to class as soon as possible so they do not get to far behind in their work
- Classes are canceled if the Hannibal School District is closed due to bad weather and emergencies. If Hannibal school classes are dismissed during the day, night classes are also canceled.
- When the student has attended classes for 12 hours, they receive a certificate of commendation
- NO smoking policy is strictly enforced on a smoke-free campus

- When the student and instructor believes that the student is ready to take the GED test, the student will be given an application form to send to Jefferson City. The application must be sent in with a \$20 cashier's check or money order. The GED tests are administered at Hannibal laGrange College. Upon receipt of an approved application from Jefferson City, the student must call the college to reserve a seat for testing. The phone number is (573) 221-3675, ext. 244. If for some reason the student is unable to keep that test date, call HLG to cancel. On test day, the student needs to bring the approved GED application, \$20 cash and proper identification (Drivers License or Identification card).

GED Option Program at KATC Guidelines

- The student must be 17 years of age or older and at least one year behind his/her cohort class in credits toward graduation.
- The student and parent/guardian must sign a consent form
- The student will participate and complete a program to enhance his or her life skills
- The student will develop skills in order to pass the five content areas of the GED tests- writing, mathematics, social studies, science, reading, and literature
- The student must satisfactorily pass a test or test on the provisions and principles of the US and Missouri constitutions as prescribed in Section 170.11, RSMo
- The student will participate in appropriate state assessments, including MAP testing
- The student will participate in workforce development activities and instruction to enhance employability

- The student will attend a minimum of 15 hours of academic preparation per week (three hours per day each day school is in session). Students will also be enrolled in other school supervised instructional activities
- The student must show a 9.0 grade level in reading and math on the TABE assessment
- The student must follow all attendance and discipline guidelines of Kirksville Area Technical Center
- The student may not graduate ahead of his/her cohort graduation class and may participate in the scheduled Kirksville R-III graduation ceremony
- The student must be at least 18 year of age by July 1 following graduation and must have a valid Missouri Driving or Non-driving license.
- The district will pay for two GED tests to take. Other retakes will be at student expense

Academic Recovery Program at KATC

Academic Recovery provides an independent learning environment in which at-risk students can complete their core subject requirements. One-on-one instruction allows students to work at their own pace. Special attention is given to increase reading, study and communication skills; this also increases the students' self-esteem and educational commitment. Additional opportunities for career exploration encourage students to consider careers, which would suit their specific skills, interests, and abilities.

Potential dropouts between the ages of 14 and 20 who are enrolled in a technical class will be eligible for placement in Academic Recovery.

GED Option Program at KATC Guidelines

- The student must be 17 years of age or older and at least one year behind his/her cohort class in credits toward graduation.
- The student and parent/guardian must sign a consent form
- The student will participate and complete a program to enhance his or her life skills
- The student will develop skills in order to pass the five content areas of the GED tests- writing, mathematics, social studies, science, reading, and literature
- The student must satisfactorily pass a test or test on the provisions and principles of the US and Missouri constitutions as prescribed in Section 170.11, RSMo
- The student will participate in appropriate state assessments, including MAP testing
- The student will participate in workforce development activities and instruction to enhance employability
- The student will attend a minimum of 15 hours of academic preparation per week (three hours per day each day school is in session). Students will also be enrolled in other school supervised instructional activities
- The student must show a 9.0 grade level in reading and math on the TABE assessment

- The student must follow all attendance and discipline guidelines of Kirksville Area Technical Center
- The student may not graduate ahead of his/her cohort graduation class and may participate in the scheduled Kirksville R-III graduation ceremony
- The student must be at least 18 year of age by July 1 following graduation and must have a valid Missouri Driving or Non-driving license.
- The district will pay for two GED tests to take. Other retakes will be at student expense

Academic Recovery Program at KATC

Academic Recovery provides an independent learning environment in which at-risk students can complete their core subject requirements. One-on-one instruction allows students to work at their own pace. Special attention is given to increase reading, study and communication skills; this also increases the students' self-esteem and educational commitment. Additional opportunities for career exploration encourage students to consider careers, which would suit their specific skills, interests, and abilities.

Potential dropouts between the ages of 14 and 20 who are enrolled in a technical class will be eligible for placement in Academic Recovery.

The PLATO Program

The PLATO Program is designed for At-Risk students enrolled in HHS who are credit deficient and at risk of not graduating. The purpose of PLATO is to address those students with credit deficiencies as well as those with severe attendance issues. Only those students who meet the following criteria, eligibility, and guidelines will be permitted to enroll in the PLATO Program.

Criteria for enrollment in PLATO

- A Sophomore with less than 6 credits after his/her Freshman year.
- A Junior with less than 12 credits after his/her Sophomore year.
- A Senior with less than 18 credits, but with greater than 15 credits after his/her Sophomore year.
- A Senior with less than 15 credits will be eligible for the GED Options Program.

- A student who has violated an attendance probation agreement.
- A student who enrolled in the middle of a semester from home school, a non-accredited school, or who is not attending school.
- A student who has transferred from another school and HHS does not offer a class in which he/she is enrolled.

Students may be enrolled in the PLATO Program only when they have earned less than 50% in an HHS course. They must first complete the HHS class and will subsequently be enrolled in the same class in PLATO as early as the following semester. (Students above a 50% are eligible for the credit recovery program at HHS.)
